On February 17, 2014 a National Holiday known as President's Day (third Monday in February) will be observed. At one time, there were two holidays in February. One honored George Washington's Birthday on February 22 and one holiday honored Abraham Lincoln's birthday on February 12.

Washington's Birthday was adopted as a holiday on February 22, 1796. Some people initially celebrated his birthday on February 11 because of an old style calendar. According to the Gregorian calendar which was used by the mid-18th century, Washington was born on February 22, 1732.

While Washington's Birthday was a federal holiday, Lincoln's birthday was not a Federal Holiday but is a legal holiday in several states.

The third Monday in February, while known as Washington's birthday, is a day for honoring Washington and Lincoln, and other men who have served as president.

rebruary 10, 2014

Major Richard Robert Wright Sr., a former slave, fought to have a day when freedom for all Americans is celebrated. Major Wright chose February 1 as National Freedom Day because it was the day in 1865 that President Lincoln signed the 13th Amendment to the Constitution.

That they approve the recommendation of the Commanderin-Chief in reference to a proper observance of the birthday of Abraham Lincoln, but would recommend that instead of denominating it is "Sons of Veterans' Day", that the same shall be known as "Union Defenders' Day", and that the Commander-in-Chief issue proper orders providing for its observance by the Order.

The Third Monday in February - President's Day

The original version of the holiday was in commemoration of George Washington's birthday in 1796 (the last full year of his presidency). Washington, according to the calendar that has been used since at least the mid-18th century, was born on February 22, 1732. According to the old style calendar in use back then, however, he was born on February 11. At least in 1796, many Americans celebrated his birthday on the 22nd while others marked the occasion on the 11th instead.

By the early 19th century, Washington's Birthday had taken firm root in the American experience as a bona fide national holiday. Its traditions included Birthnight Balls in various regions, speeches and receptions given by prominent public figures, and a lot of revelry in taverns throughout the land. Then along came Abraham Lincoln, another revered president and fellow February baby (born on the 12th of the month). The first formal observance of his birthday took place in 1865, the year after his assassination, when both houses of Congress gathered for a memorial address. While Lincoln's Birthday did not become a federal holiday like George Washington's, it did become a legal holiday in several states.

In 1968, legislation (HR 15951) was enacted that affected several federal holidays. One of these was Washington's Birthday, the

U.S. Grant Camp Membership Survey - 2014

A total of 10 surveys were returned, representing slightly less than 30% of the Camp. Six of these responses were from members who regularly or periodically attend meetings and four were from members who rarely or never attend meetings.

Members responding to the survey averaged 13.3 years as members in the SUVCW.

Member motivation to join fell into three main areas, based on the percentages: (1) representing ancestors who served in the Union army, (2) interest in interacting with those with similar interest in Civil War history and (3) based on "arm twisting" by existing members to join.

Expectations varied; however, the largest percentage was directed at educational interests. This includes discussions on specific topics of interest relative to Civil War history. There are also expectations that we engage in preservation activities directed at honoring those that helped preserve the Union. A small percentage had no expectations whatsoever.

A majority responded that U.S. Grant Camp is meeting their expectations. This was a common response from those who regularly or periodically attend meetings. However, a significant percentage noted that expectations are not being met relative to communication (e.g., no newsletter, dormant website). This was a common response from those who rarely or never attend Camp meetings. It was also noted by some that, during meetings, we need to balance the discussions about the usual business items with educational topics.

Things that the U.S. Grant Camp should be doing and is not doing, based on the percentages: (1) better communication with membership, including resurrection of the Camp newsletter, and a more informative and updated website, (2) more community involvement (e.g., educational programs,

preservation projects, etc.), (3) focused membership recruiting activities, and (4) more meeting time dedicated to Civil War history topical discussions.

It should be noted that the U.S. Grant Camp is the largest and arguably, the highest performing Camp in the Department of Missouri. It has nearly doubled in membership over the past 10 years, slightly outpacing the Department growth over that same period and far outpacing growth of the National organization. It has been a frequent winner of the Department of Missouri's James B. Eads Outstanding Camp Award and has had a number of its members win the Francis P. Blair outstanding member award. The Grant Camp has also won National awards, including the Abraham Lincoln Award for outstanding Camp and had two of its members win the Cornelius Whitehouse Award for outstanding member and a member presented the Meritorious Service Award with Gold Star.


