

REMEMBERING A CIVIL WAR VETERAN: HEADSTONE DEDICATION



(Merrill's Horse). Married Antonia Anna Johnston on 5 Oct 1862 near St. Louis. Served as a Captain of Subsistence and Commissary. Caught an illness while regiment was at Vicksburg, and later sent to Denver to so S&C duty there. He died of dysentery in Denver, 17 Dec 1864. His body was shipped back to St Louis via St Joseph, MO. For some unknown reason his grave has no marker but is in the process of having a military stone made. He was buried on 19 Jan 1865 in Bellefontaine Cemetery.
